



Branson Fall Foliage Walking/Jogging Tour #1

Branson Landing/Downtown

- **Estimated Distance:** 1.5 miles; **Time:** 50 min walking, 25 min jogging
- **Topography:** Paved walking paths/sidewalks. Wheelchair accessible. Level to moderate incline.
- **Highlights:** Lakeside walking path, Water/Fire Fountain Show, Historic Downtown, Train Depot
- **Suggested Side-Tours:** Branson Scenic Railway, Horse-drawn carriage, North Beach Park



Park in the northern Branson Landing parking lot (same side as Belk department store). Walk toward the lake to join the concrete Boardwalk path. **Turn right** toward Branson Landing.

Continue on the boardwalk about ¼ mile along the lake until you come to the Water & Fire Fountain Show at the Town Square (Great spot to rest and watch the hourly fountain show). **Turn right** (west) and climb the steps into the Town Square (or use wheelchair ramps). When you reach the shopping level, continue straight (west) through Branson Landing to the intersection of Main Street and Branson Landing Blvd.

Cross Branson Landing Blvd. at crosswalk. Pass the train depot, cross the tracks and continue west along Main Street. Cross Sycamore Street and begin climbing the hill into Historic Downtown Branson. Note foliage on both sides of Main Street.

Cross Commercial St. and continue west on Main Street (Main & Commercial is where you can take a horse-drawn carriage ride). At the intersection of Main St. and Veterans Blvd/Business 65, **turn right** (north) without crossing Veterans Blvd. and continue north for one block.

Turn right (east) onto Atlantic Street. Continue one block. **Turn left** (north) onto Commercial Street. Continue for two blocks, passing the historic Branson City Cemetery and crossing the train tracks again. At the intersection of Commercial St. and Branson Landing Blvd, **cross the street** at the marked crosswalk. Continue through the parking lot, noting the colorful trees throughout the parking lot, to return to your vehicle.

To add distance: Continue through parking lot back to the Boardwalk. **Turn left** along the North Beach Park walking path. Note mature trees and lakeside foliage.
