24 BEST FAMILY REUNION SPOTS

Thinking of getting your family together? You're part of a growing trend (more than a third of us will travel for family reunions in 2008). But where? The answer is not easy, partly because the questions are different when planning for a big group. Here's help. Armed with 21 years of Midwest travel expertise, we looked at vacation spots, as well as cities and areas that may surprise you. Behind the score: *There really are lodgings for everyone here, including big, full-service resorts and motels in the midst of Branson's shows and attractions, as well as quieter, small resorts and condominium complexes along Table Rock Lake.*

Music shows, Silver Dollar City theme park and Table Rock Lake bring travelers to this southwest Missouri vacation area. The central location appealed to Shirley King, who lives in upstate New York, and 20 family members driving from all over. Plus, the reunion planners made it easy, Shirley says.

Branson's Chamber of Commerce helps more than 450 family groups a year. After collecting a family's information, staffers send it to some of the more than 200 properties catering to reunions. Thousand Hills Resort, a sprawling complex with 18 championship golf holes, turned out to be the best fit for Shirley's family, giving the golf-loving group a chance to hold a tournament.

Appeal Will your group want to go there? Established destinations with lots of activities and reputations as vacation spots scored highest.

Location Convenience counts, especially when a group is flying in. Proximity to major cities and airports earned points.

Lodgings Many reunion groups need a range of lodging types and prices. The top scorers have something for everyone.

Planning help Top-rated tourism offices coordinate dozens of reunions a year, provide materials, dedicate staff to planning and even schedule preliminary visits to hotels and attractions for organizers.

Branson, Missouri

Thousand Hills. **Loved:** Plush new cabins and planning help.

But: It's hilly and spread out. From \$118 (800/697-9472; www.thousandhills.com).

Westgate Branson Woods Resort,

on the edge of town. **Loved:** Nicely equipped gathering spaces; lodgings, including bargain motel rooms. **But:** Drive to attractions. From \$99 (866/610-8990; www.wgbransonwoods.com).

Still Waters Condominium Resort,

lakeside. **Loved:** New swimming pool; lodgings, including updated motel rooms; outstanding marina with free water toys and new boats. **But:** Small cafe only. From \$139 (800/777-2320; www.stillwatersresort.com).

The Village At Indian Point,

lakeside. **Loved:** Family-oriented owners; nice condos; indoor gathering space with kitchen next to patio with grills. **But:** Small pool (larger pool planned for summer 2008). From \$135 (800/984-7847; www.villageatindianpoint.com).

Lake of the Ozarks, Missouri

Tan-Tar-A Resort, a huge retreat with conference and family business; some lakeside lodgings. **Loved:** Lodgings variety; bargain rates; family activities, including an indoor water park. **But:** Spread out and hilly. From \$99 (800/826-8272; www.tan-tar-a.com).

The Resort at Port Arrowhead, medium-size lakeview motel complex near area attractions. **Loved:** Rates include free meals for kids 12 and younger.

But: Standard rooms basic. From \$170 (800/532-3575; www.theresortatportarrowhead.com).

Bass Point Resort, 25-acre, family-owned, 40-year-old affordable cabin complex along the lake's quieter west side.

Loved: Relaxed, friendly vibe; beach along the lake; lots of activities. **But:** Not much close by; towels not provided; some cabin interiors basic. From \$97 (573/374-5205; www.basspoint.com).

Brainerd Lakes, Minnesota

Grand View Lodge, historic retreat on huge Gull Lake.

Loved: Planning help, beach; range of rooms, cabins, condos; spa and fine dining restaurant. **But:** Pricy. From \$340 (866/867-8939; www.grandviewlodge.com).

Madden's on Gull Lake,

sprawling along two miles of shore. **Loved:** Golf; family-friendly atmosphere; activities.

But: Lowest-price rooms pretty basic. From \$183 (800/233-2934; www.maddens.com).

Kavanaugh's Sylvan Lake Resort,

on a quieter lake south of Gull. **Loved:** New, big cottages. **But:** No restaurant. From \$215 (800/562-7061; www.kavanaugh.com).

Door County, Wisconsin

Gordon Lodge, a classic under new ownership on 130 acres on the peninsula's quieter Lake Michigan shore. **Loved:** Setting and outdoor gathering spaces; stylish redone lodge rooms.

But: Cabin interiors basic. From \$200 (800/830-6235; www.gordonlodge.com).

Eagle Harbor Inn, in the heart of Ephraim along Green Bay.

Loved: Apartmentlike suites;
